I am writing in support of the Child Advocacy Center's application for federally appropriated earmark dollars to support construction of a co-located facility in northeast Lincoln.


The Child Advocacy Center is a model of interagency collaboration in the investigation of child abuse cases. The Center works closely with law enforcement, protection and safety, medical and mental health providers to provide direct services to child victims of abuse and their non-offending family members. The Center actively assists in the investigation and prosecution of these very difficult cases by providing forensic interviews and medical evaluations, as well as ongoing support to the family. Over the past 11 years, the Center has served more than 5,250 unduplicated child victims of abuse - mostly sexual abuse.

The Child Advocacy Center has outgrown its current location in Antelope Park and is building an expanded facility in northeast Lincoln. The Center has successfully raised more than \$2 million privately in the community and is now requesting additional federal dollars from Housing and Urban Development specifically for the co-location piece of the project.

Co-location would allow law enforcement and protection and safety workers to be located on site. Other Child Advocacy Centers that have developed a co-located model have found significant improvement in coordination and communication, producing better results for families.
