Dear Senator Nelson:

As a supporter of Epworth Village, an institution initiated by the Methodist Church, I am writing to strongly support Epworth's funding requests in the FY 2011 appropriations bills. A federal investment will have a considerable impact on Epworth Village's ability to treat Nebraska's emotionally disturbed children and families, thereby helping to relieve a significant financial burden on the local, state, and federal governments.

My understanding is that Mr. Tom McBride, President and CEO of Epworth Village, and Monroe Golliday, President of the Epworth Village Board of Directors, will be meeting with your office in February to discuss these projects in more detail.
